## PROGRAM ORGANIZER NEEDED

For several years, UUTC has participated, along with other churches in the community, in the CWS (Church World Services) CROP Walk to help raise funds to assist

communities in about 70 countries worldwide. Funds are used to address root causes of hunger and deal with disaster relief and recovery needs. 25% of the money raised goes to **our local Sharing House**, which is a giant blessing according to Shelly Webb, Director of Sharing House: "We are fortunate to have a community who cares deeply for the well-being of all. It is hard living in Transylvania County with low-wage and seasonal jobs and less than reliable transportation. Winter months are unpredictable for living expenses. It is not unusual for our neighbors to wait until it is absolutely necessary to ask for help when the oil tank is low, the pantry is bare, or the electricity is about to be cut off."

Dear Members and Friends,

These last weeks have seemed chaotic and certainly unsettling. None of us could have predicted that Rev. Ilene would be leaving us so soon and for such a sad reason.

But, “Our lives (must – and do) go on . . .”

At the Board meeting this past Thursday, we set in place an interim process to welcome new Members and Friends – and we already have five individuals who have asked to become Members, and two who have asked to become Friends!

We have begun a study of UUTC by-laws, policies and procedures that govern how we identify a new settled minister. We have scheduled an additional Board meeting, June 11 at 8:30 AM, to review these documents and plan the next steps. We have begun a conversation with the Transitions group at UUA, necessary to re-launch the process by which we recruit a new, settled minister.

If you are interested in participating on the Search Team, please let a Board member know. This work requires a significant commitment of time, especially in the first quarter of 2020 (a date that is aspirational at the current moment). Search team members must be elected by a vote of the congregation; you will be hearing more about that process in the near future.

In addition, we are also — and simultaneously -- investigating the recruiting of an interim minister. Rev. Ilene has identified several potential candidates who also are geographically close to us here in Transylvania County, a real advantage both for the potential candidate and for UUTC. We hope to have clarity on the interim before the end of August, when the remarkable work of the Worship Team in recruiting speakers to cover for Rev. Ilene’s Medical Leave of Absence, was scheduled to end.

Before you took your medical leave, you wrote and gave us much needed confidence to carry on in your absence. While we did feel a bit at sea, we gathered strength, made time, got creative, went to work – and moved in a positive direction. We hope to continue with that strength and determination you believed were in us.

In April, many people attended the new members class and yesterday morning joined others of us in a free and responsible search for truth and meaning. We have every reason to believe that our growing congregation will keep growing. We can help one another in this process of finding truth and meaning—and perhaps, become even better friends and church mates.

Over the past weeks, some of us have worked diligently to transform the scraggly lot next door into an area nearly ready for our youth. We were mindful of the environment as we planned for some new construction, new plantings, and the different uses of the land. Our children soon will be able to play outside as they explore and learn to accept one another and grow spiritually. We will find additional means to nurture our children and youth and receive the joy of watching them grow in positive ways.

Anyone reading our bulletin boards will easily see that we are working hard to renew our ten-year certification of Welcoming Congregation. WE will make sure its mission – All of who you are is sacred. All of who you are is welcome—will always be honored at UUTC.

We are developing policies that will strengthen the workings of our church. This may take time because we want to be sure they are correct and fitting for us, but we will not put off doing this vital work.

Days before our last congregational meeting, we had been provided with everything necessary to make good decisions for our church. We came ready to democratically and efficiently vote. Now we are set for another year of financial and organizational stability.

People are receiving much need items because you introduced us to The Dignity Project and encouraged us to support it with our time and treasure. Men, women and teens who barely have money for food now have sources for personal products like condoms, menstrual supplies, and deodorant. We will continue with this project and will always consider it “your baby.”

Rev. Ilene, we will take care of one another; we will work hard to respect the inherent worth and dignity of every person, without exception, anywhere. And we will take care of ourselves in that new world of Self-Care.

Finally, we are resilient people. You have given us the goals, the sense of purpose and the confidence to work toward the Blessed Community. Our promise to you is that, together, we will make you proud as we make UUTC stronger. May it be so.
